Training is also being offered at the Clarion Hotel in Batavia on November 13, 2015, all day training.

Review of Charles Tiranno application for site plan and special use permit for a dog kennel to train and house up to 20 Labrador retrievers to be used for hunting. It would be located on West Shelby Rd. near Dunlop Road. There were many concerns from the earlier Public Hearing, among them dog barking noise, odor, additional traffic, and training of dogs to gun discharges. After further discussion the board felt additional time was needed to make a decision.

A motion was made by Gary Watts to recommend to the Town Board to reappoint Karl Snyder for a 5 year term along with Gary Berger as an alternate to the Town of Shelby Planning Board, seconded by Larry Hill, motion passed. Kirk Myhill will present this to the Town Board.
