Purpose of the Public Hearing- To hear comments on the adoption of proposed Local Law entitled "Mobile Food Regulation Law of 2018.

Kirk Myhill, Planning Board Chair said we have never had any food truck regulations. The mobile food truck local law would ensure food trucks are operating in the Town of Shelby with the appropriate permits and inspections from the health department, defining times of operation and parking. Bethany Centrone, Town Attorney, said this law would regulate hours of operation. There would be venting requirements. The mobile food truck would not be allowed to block traffic. All trash, waste, litter and debris shall be removed from the site of the vending operation at the end of each daily operation.
